Dear Chairman Murkowski, Chair McCollum, Ranking Member Udall, and Ranking Member Joyce:

As supporters of the Partnership Wild and Scenic Rivers program, we write to respectfully request that any anticipated conference agreement for the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill for Fiscal Year 2020 (FY20) reflect both Senate- and House-passed bills by including increased funding for the National Park Service's Partnership Wild and Scenic Rivers program within the final Operations of the Park System account.

The program currently protects 16 nationally-significant rivers and watersheds that flow through privately-owned or state-owned lands within the United States by preserving them in a natural, free-flowing condition. The program, which is unique in engaging private interests and all levels of government in studying, planning, and managing the rivers for the benefit of future generations, includes the Eightmile River (CT), Farmington River (CT), Great Egg Harbor River (NJ), Lamprey River (NH), Lower Delaware River (NJ/PA), Maurice River (NJ), Missisquoi and Trout Rivers (VT), Musconetcong River (NJ), Sudbury, Assabet and Concord Rivers (MA), Taunton River (MA), Wekiva River (FL), Westfield River (MA), and White Clay Creek (DE/PA); and the newly-designated Lower Farmington River/Salmon Brook (CT), Nashua River (MA/NH), and Wood-Pawcatuck Rivers (RI/CT).

Three new Partnership Wild and Scenic Rivers were designated this year by the John D. Dingell, Jr. Conservation, Management, and Recreation Act of 2019, making it vitally important that this growing program receive an increase in funding to provide for these new rivers. Specifically, the Senate-passed funding level of \$3.576 million ensures that these new rivers receive necessary startup funding while providing for the continued effective and efficient implementation of the approved conservation plans of the previously designated rivers.

We strongly urge you to include \$3.576 million for the Partnership Wild and Scenic Rivers program in the final conference agreement. Thank you for your consideration of our request.
