Dear Representative Courtney:

On behalf of the members of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), thank you for your ongoing leadership and for continuing to champion the "Middle Class Health Benefits Tax Repeal Act of 2019," H.R. 748. AFSCME greatly appreciates you reintroducing this legislation to repeal the 40 percent tax on employer sponsored high cost worker and retiree health benefits. Your legislation will help AFSCME members and families both in Connecticut and all across America maintain their health care benefits and afford the medical services they need.

AFSCME strongly supports H.R. 748 because the 40 percent tax already is forcing insurers and employers to lower health benefits and shift medical costs onto workers and retirees. This tax is a poorly targeted and ineffective tool. It is regressive, disproportionately burdens working families, and discriminates against older or female dominated occupations like nurses and teachers.
