I am requesting funding for the Town of Hebron Church Street Commons Housing Rehabilitation project in fiscal year 2025. The entity to receive funding for this project is the Town of Hebron, located at 15 Gilead Street, Hebron, CT, 06248. The funding would be used for the construction of approximately 50 units of mixed-income housing.
